St. Nicholas Albanian Orthodox Church
General Meeting Held Sunday, April 15, 2018

The meeting opened at 11:45 a.m. with a prayer led by Fr. Nikodhim. Jim Liolin welcomed those present to the meeting.

November 19, 2017 General Meeting: Minutes of the meeting were reviewed. **Lou Foundos motioned that the minutes be accept as presented. Seconded by Linda Foundos. A vote was taken and the motion passed.**

Correspondence: Fr. Nikodhim said he received word that Fr. Dimitri had broken his back (of St. Thomas Church in Detroit, Michigan). We had prayed for him *previously*.

Reports: (a) Pastor's Report: Fr. Nikodhim said that we have had 1 baptism. Also 3 funerals (Larry Jance, Helen Phillips and her brother Nicholas, and Agim Karagjosi. He also said that he has become a Chaplain to the Albanian community, i.e., Vatra.

Fr. Nikodhim said he has contacted the contractor regarding the Beautification Project and several other icons will be mounted.. He said that our Archdiocese will have its annual Assembly in St. Louis the day before the OCA's All-American Council. Fr. Nikodhim thanked the Sunday School teachers. The children are the future Church members. He also thanked Vasian and Bill Nasi for working with the new altar boys. Additionally he thanked those who are singing. Damian Peters added and thanked Jennifer Brehl, her son Nicholas, her husband Luke and daughter Elizabeth, who have been singing with us. Jenna and Nicholas have brought in new music. Fr. Nikodhim also thanked Mark Chenoweth teaching the Youth Group. Mark has gotten an internship at Long Island Jewish Hospital's Chaplain's program. Fr. Nikodhim also thanked Adriana Topore who has been working in the office a couple days of the week and works helping with the administrative needs.

Fr. Nikodhim then went on to say that he will doing a lot of traveling. He will be going to Boston, Holy Cross and our Cathedral with the Nicholas Brehl this next week. The following week, he will be handling a clergy retreat in Alaska. In June, he will be going to Russia. He was recommended as a representative of our Diocese. He has arranged coverage for services and emergencies. Also, he will be going to Albania in the Fall. He will be taking \$10,000 to the Archdiocese to assist the Church there. It's not just one thing we have been doing over the last 20 years. We have gone where we are needed.

(b) Sunday School: Alexandra Kehoe reported that we have expanded to two classes. One class is during Liturgy and the second is after. She thanked the parents who have been working with the classes for their assistance. Fr. Nikodhim has scheduled a children's sermon on the first Sunday of the month. We have 3 or 4 in the older group and about 4 in the younger group.

(c) Daughters of St. Nicholas: Linda Foundos gave the report. She said they take care of the Pancake breakfasts held on the Sunday before Christmas and on Palm Sunday. She thanked the ladies who decorated the Epitaphi on Good Friday. Linda also said that the Daughters are donating an icon of St. Mary's Assumption.

(d) 2017 Year End Report: (i) Lou Foundos gave the financial report first. He reviewed the report he had handed out. He said that income from the Golf Outing was down because there were fewer foursomes and sponsorships this year. The net is approximate \$14,000.

We installed WI-FI to the building. The halogen spot lights outside the building were old and replaced.

Lou stated overall the total income was \$159,453 and expenses were \$179,791 resulting in an Operating deficit of (\$20,338)

Damian Peters asked whether we have advertised that we have WI-FI? It might increase hall rentals if we advertise it. Fr. Nikodhim said it has been by word of mouth.

(ii) Lou presented the Investment Portfolio report, a copy of which was also handed out. The portfolio value at year end 2017 was \$265,995. However, \$55,000 had been taken out to be used for the Beautification Project, but will be repaid. That would bring the total to \$320,955.

Lou said that we are using Matrix Asset Advisors to handle our portfolio.

(f) President's Report: Jim Liolin reported the year ended with 115 households contributed \$72,000. This year we have had some households that didn't complete their pledge. So far, we have 92 households who have pledged and we hope to reach \$74,000. Since we have been asking for donations for the beautification project, it has impacted our annual pledges. As Fr. Nikodhim mentioned, the names of those who have pledged will be listed in the June edition of The Orthodox Post. We are currently at the \$68,000 level. Blendi Korovesi asked if the Pledge letter and card have been e-mailed in addition to being mailed out. People still have to be reminded by phone call. Some people have received a call and were annoyed by that call. They didn't make a pledge. Jim said this subject will be brought to the Council meeting for discussion. Jim then thanked all present at this meeting and contributed to the Council's discussions. Also, he thanked all who have donated to the Beautification project and the icons. He thanked Fr. Nikodhim and the members of the volunteer committee. Jim went on to thank the singers and the members who work on The Orthodox Post as well as the Daughters who have paid for the new altar boy robes and other items needed for the altar. He thanked the kitchen crew for making everyone happy. He also thanked all the Council members who have worked with him during the last four years while he has been President. Unfortunately, not all of the Council members have attended this meeting. Lastly, Jim said he hopes we will have another 75 years as a parish.

Old Business

(a) **Beautification Project:** Lou Foundos mentioned the financial numbers during the Financial Report earlier. Generally going forward, we are going in the right direction. Fr. Nikodhim said it's making the Church beautiful – a place that we can be proud of. We shall continue to accept new donations. If you haven't as yet made a donation, please do and tell your friends. Lou asked how many icons are still available. Fr. Nikodhim said there are 7 icons 4 of the large icons have been donated. 4 of 16 small icons have been donated. Fr. Nikodhim said there are only a few small items still to be done. He suggested that an assessment be made every five years or so. Blendi Korovesi asked Fr. Nikodhim about our Parish having a rectory. Fr. suggested that it should be discussed after this year. Jim Liolin said we have had experience with a rectory in the past and it should be revisited and discussed for the future. Jim asked Mark Papalexis to talk about the Bishop's visit on Saturday, May 19th at 11:00 AM when clergy from other Orthodox churches in the area will be able to attend. It will be a brief service. During the Lenten period, we haven't been able to host Vespers. The Catholic priest, the Imam and other community leaders and public officials will be invited. This will put us on the map so to speak and highlight our 75 years of service. After the service and the blessing of the icons, we will have a light lunch for those in attendance. Mark said he will meet with the Daughters to discuss the buffet luncheon. He will need people to serve and to assist in setting up the tables.

(b) **75th Anniversary Celebration:** Mark Papalexis gave the report. He said the Celebration is scheduled to take place on Saturday, October 20, 2018 at Terrace on the Park. We will have a dinner and an open bar. Also, Mark said that Bishop Nikon will attend. He said that Damian Peters will be handling the journal. We will have the room from 7:00 PM to 12:00 Midnight. We have to talk it up to the community. Mark said we have guaranteed 200 people and if we get 250 or 300, we can expand the space. Blendi Korovesi suggested that Albanian TV should be contacted. Adrianna Topore asked about the ticket price. She said people have been asking. Mark Papalexis said we will have it after Tuesday.

(c) **Mt. Tomori Cemetery:** Jim Liolin said that we have had a number of burials and one was an unfortunate one. Helen Phillips and her brother Nicholas died within a month of each other. They had no family and assistance was needed to arrange opening of the 2 plots. The Parish assisted in the opening of the graves and funerals. Nicholas died unexpectedly and Helen was placed in hospice care. Their mother and Helen's son were buried decades ago and Helen had requested that she and her brother be buried in Mt. Tomori. Fr. Nikodhim had contacted Cypress Hills Cemetery about assistance in opening the graves which Helen and her brother had purchased years ago. Fr. Nikodhim recommended that everyone have end of life arrangements in place. That would consist of purchasing a burial plot, funeral arrangements and other related expenses. Chris Liolin said that when her parents went into a nursing home, she and her brother made those arrangements. A few months later her parents passed and everything was done. Lou Foundos said that a few years ago, a young man died in a car accident and the Parish handled the burial and the young man's friends handled the funeral. Fr. Nikodhim recommended that the price of the plot at Mt. Tomori be increased. He asked that the Parish Council take this increase under discussion and then bring a proposal to a General Meeting. Jim Liolin said it would not take place before the next General Meeting in the Fall.

(d) **Elections:** Jim Liolin said the current Council has 9 members and there should be an odd number so that there is no tie. He said that this year, Lou Foundos, Bill Peters, Izzy Tsablakos and Iliia Luka are coming off the Council and we will need 4 new members. Jim said he spoke to Bill Peters and Lou Foundos and both have agreed to continue as members if nominated. He went on to say that Izzy Tsablakos won't continue on the Council but has agreed to continue to serve as legal counsel. Jim said he and Mark Papalexis, Damian Peters, Zhani Joanidhi and John Jance will be remaining on the Council until next year. Fr. Nikodhim said that Alexandra Kehoe and Blendi Korovesi have agreed to be nominated. **Lou Foundos made a motion that the additional names be made members of the Council and Johanna Heiser seconded the motion. The new Council will consist of Jim Liolin, Mark Papalexis, Damian Peters, Zhani Joanidhi, John Jance, Lou Foundos, Bill Peters, Alexandra Kehoe and Blendi Korovesi. A vote was taken and the motion passed.** Fr. Nikodhim said that the new Council will be sworn in on May 19th when Bishop Nikon is here to bless the new icons and newly beautified Church. Chris Liolin suggested that the Council members wear a name tag identifying them as a Council member. She attends a Church in Florida and that is the practice of the Council members there.

(e) **Archdiocesan Assembly and OCA All American Council:** Fr. Nikodhim said that since the Archdiocese Assembly will be taking place in St. Louis at the time of the OCA's All American Council, that the Parish Council be empowered to choose delegates for both events.

Lou Foundos made the motion that the Parish Council be empowered to choose delegates for the Archdiocese Assembly and OCA All American Council in St. Louis and Damian Peters seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

There being no further business, Fr. Nikodhim said a closing prayer.

Damian Peters made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Johanna Heiser seconded. A vote was taken and the motion passed. The meeting adjourned at 1:10 p.m.


St. Nicholas Church was honored with a “Proclamation” from the New York City Council presented by Mark Gjonaj, Council Member of the 13th District. It acknowledged St. Nicholas Church’s 75th Anniversary and its many years of devotion and service to the community.

Finally, the 75th Anniversary Commemorative Journal was introduced with copies distributed to guests.

NOVEMBER SAINT AND NAME DAYS

The Entry of the Most Holy Mother of God into the Temple Commemorated on November 21

When the Most Holy Virgin reached the age of three, the holy parents decided to fulfill their vow. They gathered together their relatives and acquaintances, and dressed the All-Pure Virgin in Her finest clothes. Singing sacred songs



and with lighted candles in their hands, virgins escorted Her to the Temple (Ps. 44/45:14-15). There the High Priest and several priests met the handmaiden of God. In the Temple, fifteen high steps led to the sanctuary, which only the priests and High Priest could enter. (Because they recited a Psalm on each step, Psalms 119/120-133/134 are called "Psalms of Ascent.") The child Mary, so it seemed, could not make it up this stairway. But just as they placed Her on the first step, strengthened by the power of God, She quickly went up the remaining steps and ascended to the highest one. Then the High Priest, through inspiration from above, led the Most Holy Virgin into the Holy of Holies, where only the High Priest entered once a year to offer a purifying sacrifice of blood. Therefore, all those present in the Temple were astonished at this most unusual occurrence. But there are accounts in Church Tradition, that during the All-Pure Virgin's stay at the Temple, She grew up in a community of pious virgins, diligently read the Holy Scripture, occupied Herself with handicrafts, prayed constantly, and grew in love for God. From ancient times, the Church has celebrated the Feast of the Entry of the Most Holy Theotokos into the Temple. Indications that the Feast was observed in the first centuries of Christianity are found in the traditions of Palestinian Christians,

which say that the holy Empress Helen (May 21) built a church in honor of the Entry of the Most Holy Theotokos into the Temple. **The Feast of the Entry of the Most Holy Theotokos into the Temple foretells God's blessing for the human race, the preaching of salvation, the promise of the coming of Christ.**
