Pastor's Message by Fr. Nikodhim

Happy New Year! (Yes, really)

Just two things in this world are unavoidable: death and taxes, as that old adage assures us. Today, we will be looking at the latter. In our Eastern Christian tradition, September marks the start of the year, and each September first is celebrated as the beginning of a new year. This is the continuation of ancient Roman custom that was brought to prominence in the Byzantine period. Remember that the Byzantine Empire and its rulers were Caesars and Romans, the capital city of that multilingual international state having been relocated from Rome to New Rome/Constantinople (now Istanbul) by St. Constantine himself. And September 1st was tax day, the April 15th of its age. Perhaps if they drank to ring in the year it was more to steady their nerves against the money missing from their accounts than it was to celebrate. In any case, September as the start of the annual fiscal cycle, was their January, and though empires grow, crest, and disappear, our Church still retains the start of September as a new beginning. Even now, in many or most books of our hymns or saints or feast days, you won't find January near the beginning but sandwiched somewhere near the middle of those volumes that start with September.

O Creator of the universe, Thou didst appoint times by Thy power; bless the crown of this year with Thy goodness, O Lord. Preserve in safety Thy rulers and cities: and through the intercessions of the Theotokos, save us!

This is one of the hymns for the Church's New Year. We note in it at least two vital details. First, God blesses what He has created. 
